CHOOSING A CANDIDATE

Choosing a candidate can be an overwhelming choice for some voters. There is a lot to consider—from a candidate's qualifications, voting history, and policy platforms. Below are some tools to help voters find candidates who align with their own values and beliefs.

I SIDE WITH

I Side With is a nonpartisan quiz that will help you determine how your beliefs align with those of current candidates running for office.

POLITICAL TYPOLOGY QUIZ

Using a nationally representative survey conducted by the Pew Research Center, Pew Research offers the Political Typology Quiz to help you identify which political group best fits you and your

values.

VOTE SMART

Learn which Presidential and Congressional candidates are most like you in Vote Smart's unbiased research tool and quiz, Vote Easy.

BALLOT AND ISSUE GUIDES

<u>VOTE411</u>

Vote411's website includes a nonpartisan ballot guide that creates personalized ballot information for users. Candidate information is centered around the candidates' responses to questions from the League of Women Voters.

BALLOTREADY

Allows users to enter their address and access nonpartisan information about everything on their ballot. Users can then fill it out and use it as a reference for when they vote. They can also share their ballot with friends and family.

BALLOTPEDIA

Covers an extensive variety of information about elections, policies, voting, and government in the United States. Includes the BallotReady portal for students to view what's on their ballot.
